Special Education Teacher Residency Program

Earn a TUITION-FREE master's degree and an initial teaching license in one year!

The Teacher in Residence (TIR) program is a collaboration between NNPS and Old Dominion University that offers a fast track to both a master's degree and an initial teaching license in special education for highly motivated candidates committed to the teaching profession.

Teachers in Residence receive professional development and on-going support from veteran teachers and from ODU faculty. TIRs teach alongside their veteran teacher coaches and earn a tuition-free master's degree and a license to teach in the first year.

After successful completion of this preparation year, TIRs are given hiring priority and are expected to commit to teaching in NNPS for three years.

QUICK FACTS ABOUT THE TEACHER IN RESIDENCE PROGRAM:

- Ten candidates will be selected for the 2022-23 school year.
- TIR is a 12-month program.
- Teachers in Residence can earn up to \$20,000 in the internship and receive full funding for up to 32 credits of tuition and fees at in-state rates.
- The GRE is waived for those in the program.



Who should apply? Ideal candidates:

- Have a bachelor's degree;
- Are current employees of NNPS or are willing to commit to teaching in NNPS; and
- Are eager to work with exceptional learners.
